Sub-Committee Goal(s):	Increase connectedness between people, family members, and community. Increase resiliency and help-seeking.		
Sub-Committee Objective(s):	 Increase services focused on fostering a sense of belonging. Promote a culture free of stigma and discrimination. Integrate activities into community-based services that increase life skills. Expand services to increase help-seeking behaviors and promote messages of resiliency, recovery, and hope. 		
Last Quarter's Actions:	 Youth initiative – Together with La Sierra University developed social media content promoting mental health awareness, healthy coping tips, and suicide prevention. The social media content was shared on multiple platforms, and even highlighted at the October Suicide Prevention Coalition conference. Youth initiative- Created an upstream wellness calendar which includes tips and content that sites can use for their own social media postings. Older Adult Initiative – The wellness kits for older adults project has been completed. We distributed over 3600 kits to isolated or home bound seniors. A more developed report on the project will be sent to leadership 		
Community Partners Needed:	Continued support from community members, sub-committee members, etc.		
Priority Activities this Quarter:	 Develop new objectives for youth initiatives. Begin to develop a plan to engage with various sites to offer suicide prevention trainings at local senior or community centers and try to engage caregivers on how to support someone in crisis.

Sub-Committee Objective(s):	 Trainings to increase effectiveness of suicide risk screenings, assessments, and trauma-informed practices. Training to support identification and intervention to effective care. 	
Last Quarter's Actions:	 Created a public service announcement (PSA), which local trainers were utilized to discuss the importance of being trained in suicide prevention. Created an outreach plan to encourage widespread sharing of the PSA to reach every individual of Riverside County. Recruitment of trainers, an increase of scheduled trainings has been created. 	
Community Partners Needed:	ASIST, safeTALK and MHFA trainers and continued support of members, other sub-committees, etc.	
Priority Activities this Quarter:	 Dissemination of PSA, beginning the development of a formal request template to outreach to local business about screening PSA (Movie theaters, gas stations, waiting rooms, DMV, etc.) Continuous efforts to increase the number of trainings offered and training attendance through outreach.

Last Quarter's Actions:	 Successful recording of a training video for staff and faculty titled, "How to Help a Student in Distress." Continued distribution of the PSA Video. Continuous implementation of self-care techniques to Staff/Faculty reiterating the importance of taking care of yourself so that you can take care of your students.

Last Quarter's Actions:	 The Suicide Reporting and Crisis Response Pilot Project planning document and timeline are now complete. The team has begun working on tasks within each of the four activities 			
Community Partners Needed:	Riverside County School Districts			
Priority Activities this Quarter:	 Create an application and selection rubric to incorporate the vision for school-based health centers and how they would support the mental health and wellness needs of students. Send email for LEAs to be considered to be part of this work. Gather information from other LEAs about risk assessments/screening tools already in use. Continue refining the Logic Model with the Engaging Schools Sub-committee, with particular focus on the Activities section.

Sub-Committee Goal(s):	Deliver a continuum of crisis services across the county and evaluate crisis services to identify gaps in care. Create safe environments by reducing access to lethal means and develop professional competence to reduce risk and promote community safety.	
Sub-Committee Objective(s):	 Improve transition in care of consumers following a hospitalization or a consumer/family contact with crisis system of care. Develop relationships with community partners that are willing to work with the committee to reduce access to lethal means to improve community safety. Develop a recommendation for countywide best practice professional trainings on means safety and consumer care for the consumer with suicidal ideation. 	
ast Quarter's Actions:	 The Crisis team reports that they are receiving a lot of positive feedback from the use of the flyer. The implementation of the Firearm Lock Initiative has begun. A distribution of about 1000 firearm locks has been completed. New requests for additional firearm locks from county staff and community agencies. 	
Community Partners Needed:	Training subcommittee	
Priority Activities:	 Explore options for new co-chairs to lead the Intervention Subcommittee Explore funding source (s) for continued Firearm distribution. Identify and implement a system to measure the effect and the success of the distribution. Continue to print and distribute care transitions flyers. Create and develop a training pilot of Cultural Competency and Awareness training for Senior Clinical staff and Crisis Care direct care Supervisory staff with the Training subcommittee.

Sub-Committee Objective(s):	 Develop and implement postvention team(s) to coordinate effective response at various levels and across multiple settings. 	
	 Implement and expand survivor's support groups into systems of care to address immediate, delayed, and ongoing support. 	
	3. Provide trainings to clinical staff on complicated grief and bereavement to better serve suicide loss survivors.	
Last Quarter's Actions:	 Members of the Postvention subcommittee along with the Trauma Intervention Program (TIP) attended all three Inland Empire Out of the Darkness Walks, in which connections were made with loss survivors and community groups across Riverside County. Increasing members and group facilitators. 	
Community Partners Needed:	Loss survivors, Coroner's Office, Law Enforcement	
Priority Activities:	Request another team lead from Survivors of Suicide Loss (SOSL). Explore alternative suicide loss support group curriculum.	
	Develop training curriculum and recruit therapists to offer short-term, no cost, suicide grief counseling to suicide loss survivors.	
	Long-term: Focus on youth support/resources.
